Re: *Ex Parte* Notice: *Terrestrial Use of the 2473-2495 MHz Band for Low-Power Mobile Broadband Networks* – IB Docket No. 13-213

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On July 1, 2016, I spoke by telephone with Commissioner Michael O’Rielly and urged that the Commission expeditiously adopt its proposed rules allowing Globalstar, Inc. (“Globalstar”) to provide Terrestrial Low Power Service (“TLPS”) in the 2.4 GHz band. As Globalstar has shown, TLPS on IEEE 802.11 Channel 14 will relieve wireless congestion and increase broadband capacity at 2.4 GHz while protecting existing Wi-Fi services in this band. TLPS will improve the wireless broadband experience for American consumers.

During our call, I also discussed with Commissioner O’Rielly a potential framework that would permit third parties to gain opportunistic use of Channel 14 where Globalstar has not deployed TLPS, without disrupting licensed and unlicensed services. Under this approach, Globalstar’s Network Operating System would protect Globalstar’s Mobile Satellite Service and other services from harmful interference. I also pointed out that it is critical that this framework balance the Commission’s key policy interests and encourage investment and efficient use of spectrum.

Pursuant to section 1.1206(b)(2) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b)(2), this *ex parte* notification is being filed electronically for inclusion in the public record of the above-referenced proceeding.
