RE: Supplement to previously submitted requests for waiver of rule section 90.179 for the Michigan Public Safety Communications System for Wolverine Power Supply Cooperative, Inc. and its cooperative members.

The Michigan Department of Technology Management and Budget (DTMB) represents Michigan's Public Safety Communications System (MPSCS) in matters relating to FCC licenses, antenna structure registrations, etc.

In August and December of 2016, DTMB previously requested waivers of FCC rule 90.179 to allow Critical Infrastructure provider, Wolverine Power Supply Cooperative, Inc. and its cooperative members, which are not eligible to use public safety frequencies, use of the 800 MHz public safety frequencies licensed to the MPSCS on a general basis. Waiver requests were submitted individually for each member identified below:

- Wolverine Power Supply Cooperative, Inc. (Wolverine) – Submitted Aug 26, 2016
 - Great Lakes Electric Cooperative (GLE) – Submitted Aug 4, 2016
 - Home Works Tri-County Electric Cooperative (HWTC) – Submitted Aug 4, 2016
 - Presque Isle Electric & Gas Co-op (PIE&G) – Submitted Aug 4, 2016
 - Midwest Energy Cooperative (Midwest) – Submitted Dec 21, 2016

This letter serves to clarify that Wolverine Power Supply Cooperative, Inc. and its cooperative members will also share its B/ILT licensed frequencies with MPSCS on a cost-shared, non-profit basis in order to enhance MPSCS capacity. This arrangement will be documented in a written agreement between the parties pursuant to 90.179 (d).

For the shared frequencies, each party will maintain and administer the FCC licenses for the spectrum in which they are eligible.

The following table identifies the sites by calls sign where we plan to share spectrum. Additional spectrum will be added to many of these sites to support the increase in radio traffic.
