SECTION 63.71 APPLICATION OF WINDSTREAM SERVICES, LLC

PAETEC Communications LLC ("PAETEC") an affiliate of Windstream Services, LLC ("Windstream"), through its undersigned counsel and pursuant to Section 214 of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended, 47 U.S.C. §214, and Section 63.71 of the Federal Communications Commission's ("Commission") rules, 47 C.F.R. §63.71, hereby files this Application for authority to impair or discontinue Toll-Free service in the manner described below to a limited number of customers pursuant to Section 63.71, with such impairment/discontinuance to occur as part of decommissioning a legacy toll-free services platform and upgrading to a newer technology platform.

. In support of this Application, Windstream submits the following information:

1. Information listed in 47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(1)-(4) (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(b)(2)):

a. Name and Address of Carrier (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(1)-(4), (b)(2)):

b. Date of Planned Discontinuance (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(2), (b)(2)):

Windstream plans to replace the PAETEC toll-free platform on or about September 1, 2018, with simultaneous turn-up of the new platform.

c. Point of Geographic Areas of Service Affected (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(3), (b)(2)):

The “Affected” Customers” (as described below) are located in the areas of Hyde Park, MA, Hudson, NH, Morristown, NJ, New York, NY and King of Prussia, Norristown and Philadelphia, PA.

d. Brief Description of the Type of Service to be Affected (47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(4), (b)(2)):

The service to be affected is Toll-Free service as provided via PAETEC’s legacy Platform (“Affected Service”).to customers who currently utilize an international ring-to-number (“RTN”).

2. Brief Description of the Dates and Methods of Notice to All Affected Customers (47 C.F.R. § 63.71 (b)(3)):

On July 11, 2018 Windstream sent by First Class U.S. Mail notices to all Affected Customers of the planned service impairment/discontinuance. A copy of such notice as sent to these customers is attached hereto as Attachment 1, the notice being compliant with, among other things, Section 63.71(a)(5) of the Commission’s rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(5).

3. Regulatory Classification of Carrier (47 C.F.R. § 63.71 (a)(4)):

Windstream is nondominant with respect to the Affected Service.

4. Service:

In accordance with Section 63.71(a)(1) of the Commission's rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)(1), Windstream is submitting a copy of this Application by First Class U.S. Mail to the Massachusetts Department of Public Utilities, the New Hampshire Public Utilities Commission, the New Jersey Board of Public Utilities, the New York Public Service Commission, the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission, the Office of Massachusetts Governor, Charlie Baker, the Office of New Hampshire Governor, Chris Sununu, the Office of New Jersey Governor, Phil Murphy, the Office of New York Governor Andrew Cuomo, the Office of Pennsylvania Governor Tom Wolf and also to the Secretary of Defense (at the address given in 47 C.F.R. § 63.71(a)).

5. Additional Questions Regarding This Application May be Addressed to the Undersigned.

6. Circumstances of Discontinuance.

PAETEC is providing Toll-Free service to customers via an end-of-life platform. A limited number of these customers - 14 in total (1 enterprise customer and 13 small business customers) currently use an international RTN with their service on that legacy platform (the "Affected Customers"), which is scheduled to be decommissioned on or about September 1, 2018. Windstream is replacing the legacy platform with a newer technology Toll-Free service platform which requires customers to use a domestic RTN; thus, the Affected Customers will need to switch to use of a domestic RTN to maintain Toll-Free service from Windstream. The Affected Customers are located across five states in the specific areas of Hyde Park, MA, Hudson, NH, Morristown, NJ, New York, and King of Prussia, Norristown and Philadelphia, PA.

To the extent Affected Customers are willing to switch to a domestic RTN, Windstream will assist the them in migrating their services to Windstream's supported Toll-Free service.

Alternatively, customers will have sufficient time to make arrangements to obtain Toll-Free service from another service provider.

7. Conclusion

Windstream believes that the proposed service impairment is reasonable and necessary. As outlined herein, Windstream will take reasonable steps, to the extent that it is able, to assure that the impairment/discontinuance of this service is not unduly disruptive to the present or future public convenience and necessity. These customers will not be unduly harmed because they are being provided ample notice of the discontinuance, are being offered the alternative of moving their Toll-free service to the supported Windstream platform (subject to use of a domestic RTN), and have the option to move service to an alternative provider.

Accordingly, Windstream respectfully requests that the Commission grant it authority to impair/discontinue Toll-Free service in the manner described herein to the limited number of Affected Customers pursuant to Section 63.71, with such action to occur as part of decommissioning a legacy toll-free services platform and in favor of a newer technology platform.
