On July 11, 2016, Rick Chessen and Neal Goldberg of the National Cable & Telecommunications Association; Stacy Fuller, Alex Starr, and Raquel Noriega of AT&T/DIRECTV; and Paul Glist of Davis Wright Tremain held a conference call regarding the above-referenced proceeding with Gigi Sohn, Counselor to the Chairman Wheeler, Louisa Terrell, Advisor to the Chairman; John Williams of the Office of General Counsel; Scott Jordan, Chief Technologist; Eric Feigenbaum; and Brendan Murray of the Media Bureau.

The participants discussed using open standards-based HTML5 apps for promoting increased competition in navigation devices, as proposed by representatives from MVPDs and independent, minority-owned TV networks and described in the ex parte notice of June 16, 2016. We discussed the availability of HTML5 apps in addition to other bilateral commercial agreements that MVPDs and manufacturers of retail navigation devices may continue to enter into, such as the agreements that support major retail platforms today; and security arrangements used for MVPD service. We also discussed that under the proposal, consumers who utilize the HTML5 app to receive service would be charged for MVPD service but not an additional “app fee” for the app.
