On July 14, 2016, Wade Henderson, President & CEO of The Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights, spoke by telephone to FCC staff to discuss the above-captioned dockets. FCC staff participating in these calls were Commissioner Mignon Clyburn and her advisor; and Gigi Sohn. Mr. Henderson expressed disappointment that the FCC has yet to fulfil its obligation to collect correct data and to conduct the studies that it can use to support the agency's policymaking in the area of media diversity.
