Dear Chairman Pai,

I am reaching out to convey my support for Charter Communications' request to sunset two merger conditions next May: (1) the prohibition on imposing data caps and usage-based pricing and (2) the requirement to offer to connect its IP network to any qualifying entity free of charge and on standardized terms.

For more than 150 years, Boys & Girls Clubs of America has enabled young people most in need to achieve great futures as productive, caring, responsible citizens. Today, 4,300 Clubs serve nearly 4 million young people across our country. Charter has a proven track record of supporting many of our Clubs, including the Boys & Girls Club of Fremont County, where I serve as CEO.

Last year, the Boys & Girls Club of Fremont County received 10 laptops and 10 tablets from Charter. These are critical tools for some of our academic success programs, such as Power Hour, where members spend time on homework, receive tutoring, or work on other learning projects; My.Future, a technology-based program providing members with a foundation of technology skills that explore three central themes: building exploring and communicating; and STEM, where members engage with hands-on projects that allow them to experience science, technology, engineering and math.

Charter's tremendous generosity will help us in our mission to inspire and enable all young people, especially those who need us most, to realize their full potential as productive, responsible, and caring citizens for years to come.
