PEAK Internet is an Internet Services Provider (ISP) serving 8,000 rural consumers in Oregon from the cascade mountains to the pacific ocean. We have been in business for over twenty years with a focus on providing broadband in underserved areas where little or no broadband exists. We currently have 52 employees and have been recognized by several local organizations for our commitment to service and community.

We utilize a variety of technologies in serving our customers including legacy dial up, digital subscriber line (DSL) satellite, fiber to the home (FTTH) and a mix of wireless (2.5, 3650-3700, 5.8, 900 and LMDS. We offer speeds from 1 Megabit to a 1 Gigabit and operate a 24 x 7 network operations center and support desk.

We are committed to making substantial investments in current and new tower sites to provide additional coverage and higher speeds to meet the needs of our rural, underserved subscribers by deploying LTE 3.650-3.700 Mhz. Having access to the CBRS spectrum is a critical component to make this a reality for our rural consumers and for the survivability of our company.

I urge the commission to keep the CBRS spectrum plan as proposed and deny the petitions of the CTIA and T-Mobile
