The public WiFi they brought to the Cheyenne Depot Plaza has helped attract tourism to downtown Cheyenne and helped grow local businesses. My constituents have benefited from Charter's Spectrum Internet Assist program, which brings low-cost broadband to families and seniors. Overall, their investments and reliable broadband services have been an important source of opportunities for my constituents and the greater Cheyenne community.

Please consider this letter my formal support, on behalf of Wyoming HD 43, for the petition filed by Charter Communications, Inc. for consent to sunset on May 18, 2021 two conditions related to its merger with Time Warner Cable Inc. and Bright House Networks, LLC: (1) the prohibition on Charter imposing data caps and usage-based pricing mechanisms; and (2) the requirement for Charter to offer to connect its Internet protocol (IP) network to any qualifying entity free of charge and on standardized terms. It's time to create a level playing field so good corporate citizens like Charter can continue investing in communities like mine.
