Re: Notice of Ex Parte Regarding Implementation of Section 621 (MB Docket No. 05-311) and Kari's Law (PS Docket Nos. 18-261, 17-239).

Dear Ms. Dortch:

This notice is submitted pursuant to the exemptions found in Sections 1.1203, 1.1204 and 1.1206, including Section 1.1203(a)(1), Section 1.1204(a)(10), and Section 1.1206 (b)(2)(v) of the Commission's rules. On the morning of July 29, 2019, representatives of the City of New York ("the City" or "NYC")¹ met with FCC Commissioner Geoffrey Starks and Michael Scurato, Acting Legal Advisor for Media and Consumer Protection, during the Commissioner's visit to the City for a tour of NYC's Public Safety Answering Center and NYC's Network and Security Operations Center. In response to a question from the Commissioner on the City's position as articulated in its recent filing to the FCC's proposed order in MB Docket No. 05-311², the City briefly stated its filed position on the significant and adverse impacts on the City's Institutional Network ("I-Net"), citing the Fire Department of New York example. Also, NYPD staff
