**Re: Surrender of the Domestic Section 214 Authorization of Expereo, USA Inc.**

Dear Ms. Dortch:

This letter surrenders, effective immediately, the Domestic Section 214 Authorization of Expereo, USA Inc. ("Expereo"). Expereo does not provide telecommunications service to any U.S. customers on a common carrier basis or offer telecommunications service for sale in the marketplace. For these reasons, Expereo respectfully submits that it is not subject to the customer notification requirements of Section 63.71 of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 63.71.

Because Expereo does not currently provide telecommunications service that require Section 214 authority, and therefore has no U.S. customers for these services, Expereo respectfully submits that the surrender of the Domestic 214 authorization is reasonable and will not harm the present or future public interest, convenience and necessity.

Expereo is filing a letter to surrender its International Section 214 Authorization (IB File No. ITC-214-20100729-00309) using IBFS.
