Dear people:

I am writing to oppose the proposed legislation which would restrict or eliminate person-to-person solicitations to residential homes. In the real estate industry it is critical that we be allowed to contact people at home. To a great extent our livelihood depends upon it. This is also true of other industries which rely upon commissioned salespeople. I feel that there is a critical difference between a person calling another person to ask if he or she would like to utilize their services and automatic solicitations by computers which do not immediately respond if the person being called does not want the service and tie up the telephone line for an extended period of time. I can see the need to regulation of computer solicitation. To restrict or eliminate the ability of salespeople to contact homeowners runs against the spirit of free enterprise and entrepreneurship which this country needs to foster if we are going to pull out of our economic doldrums. I urge you not to create such roadblocks. Thank you for your consideration.
