**JOINT MOTION OF AT&T MOBILITY LLC AND IOWA WIRELESS SERVICES, LLC  
TO WITHDRAW AND DISMISS (1) AMENDED FORMAL COMPLAINT AND (2)  
APPLICATION FOR REVIEW OF DECEMBER 18, 2015 LETTER RULING**

1. AT&T Mobility LLC (“AT&T”) and Iowa Wireless Services, LLC (“iWireless”) respectfully submit this joint motion (“Joint Motion”) to withdraw and dismiss pleadings that they have filed in this proceeding and that are currently pending before the Commission.

2. On December 23, 2015, AT&T filed an Amended Formal Complaint and Legal Analysis against iWireless pursuant to Sections 201, 202, 203, 208 and 301 of the Communications Act (the “Act”), 47 U.S.C. §§ 201, 202, 203, 208, 301, and Section 1.720 *et seq.* and 20.12 of the Commission’s rules, 47 C.F.R. §§ 1.720 *et seq.* 20.12 (“Amended Complaint”). On January 22, 2016, iWireless filed its “Answer and Legal Analysis in Response to the Amended Formal Complaint and Legal Analysis of AT&T Mobility LLC.” On February 5, 2016, AT&T filed its Reply in Support of Amended Formal Complaint and Legal Analysis.

3. On October 21, 2015, AT&T filed a Motion for Interim Relief, File No. EB-15-MD-007, which was opposed by iWireless.<sup>1</sup> On December 18, 2015, the Enforcement Bureau issued a Letter Ruling granting AT&T's Motion for Interim Relief.<sup>2</sup> On January 19, 2016, iWireless filed an Application for Review of the Letter Ruling. ("Application for Review"). On February 3, 2016, AT&T filed a Response to iWireless' Application for Review.

4. Because the parties have reached a voluntary settlement of their disputes, AT&T seeks to withdraw and dismiss its Amended Complaint, and iWireless seeks to withdraw and dismiss its Application for Review. Further, iWireless expressly consents to the withdrawal and dismissal of AT&T's Amended Complaint, and AT&T expressly consents to the withdrawal and dismissal of iWireless' Application for Review.

5. Granting the parties' Joint Motion would serve the public interest by promoting the private resolution of disputes and by eliminating the need for further expenditure of time and resources by the parties and the Commission.<sup>3</sup>
