Nevada Radio LLC, licensee of radio facilities in Battle Mountain, Nevada, has reviewed the Comments of Shainis & Peltzman, Chartered which were filed in the above-referenced Docket. We are also familiar with the Petition for Rulemaking filed by Geo-Broadcast Solutions, RM No. 11659, which is referenced in the Shainis & Peltzman Comments.

Nevada Radio LLC urges the Commission to take whatever steps it deems appropriate to expeditiously modify Section 74.1231(i) of the Commission's rules, allowing for origination of programming on booster facilities. As explained in the Shainis & Peltzman Comments, the public interest benefits are significant. Nevada Radio LLC believes that adoption of this minor rule change will allow for a much needed boost for the radio industry, the economy, and not least, the public welfare.

In the example of KNNT-FM, Battle Mountain Nevada, we would have an opportunity to take the station to a full Class C facility, putting a contour over both Winnemucca, Nevada and Elko, Nevada.

We could then put booster stations in both communities.

An adoption of the proposed rulemaking would allow for separate newscasts to each community and, as an example of a community service, three different high school football games at the same time on a Friday night.

While the three communities have a great degree of commonality there are also local differences which can be addressed through such technology to the benefit of both the radio station operator and the community itself.
