**Summary for Update to *Ex Parte* Meeting**

On November 9, 2016, a representative from the FEMA IPAWS Program Management Office met via conference call with members of the FCC's Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau. As part of that discussion FEMA indicated that the FEMA IPAWS Lab had produced an audio file containing non-functional sound-alike EAS data headers, Attention Signal, and EOM data bursts for use in educational public service announcements. FEMA also indicated that it was working on locating the file along with other publicly accessible FEMA media items available via the FEMA website.

FEMA has now placed the non-functional sound-alike EAS audio file on its web site. The file can be obtained at this webpage: <https://www.fema.gov/emergency-alert-system-participants>. If one scrolls down to the "Additional References" section, the link to the audio may be found in the drop down.
