**Subject:** Opposition to the FCC Third Report and Order on Cable In-Kind

I am writing today to express my opposition to the FCC Third Report and Order on Cable In-Kind.

At a local level, we need time; time to review and analyze the proposed order in greater detail. The proposed order appears to expand the scope of what could have been reasonably noticed in the September 2018 proposal of rule-making, and further review is needed.

This effort to increase internet and broadband technology costs for our local government agencies will damage our efforts to provide efficient and effective services to the residents of Multnomah County.

In addition to increasing our costs, this overreach is attempting to restrict local municipalities nation wide from being able to manage and charge access to the public right of way.

Please rethink the in-kind and mixed-use rules as it impacts local governments. I urge you to delay voting on the proposed order that is currently on the August 1 agenda.
