The proposed rule is not in the public interest.

The proposed rule omits one simple fact: the internet was created by the public, and is therefore property of the public. The public must be free to choose its own content on the internet.

ISPs are common carriers, and common carriers cannot own or control content, their sole role is transmission. To give them, *for free*, the rights proposed in the rule is a gross misallocation of public property, and an obscene example of corporate welfare.
