

Support for Net Neutrality

I strongly SUPPORT NET NEUTRALITY and the 2015 ruling that places the internet under Title II authority enabling the FCC to regulate ISPs as a public utility, requiring that they treat all online content equally and cannot slow down, speed up or block content!

Giant corporations shouldn't dictate how we use the internet. Most people agree with that principle, and that's why the Federal Communications Commission passed the incredibly popular net neutrality rules in 2015

I strongly OPPOSE the move of FCC Chairman Ajit Pai to [rescind](#) the 2015 rules, and rollback the net neutrality rules. Naming this rule “the Restoring Internet Freedom Act,” is meant to confuse consumers into supporting this proposal that certainly will leave corporations with vastly more power to control how we consume information online.

Public support for net neutrality is strong—a recent **Politico/Morning Consult [poll](#) shows 60 percent of registered voters support the rules, and only 17 percent oppose it.** This is the second attempt to significantly erode online consumer rights. In April, President Trump signed a law that allows ISPs to [sell customers' private browser histories](#), even though in a March HuffPost/YouGov poll, [83 percent of adults](#) said it “[should not be allowed](#).”

It is high time for Congress to finally step up—after multiple decades of hibernation—and pass affirmative, bipartisan legislation that makes net neutrality the law of the land.

Once again big money is behind this proposed change. In this case, four major ISPs that support the plan to eliminate net neutrality rules—Comcast Corp., AT&T, Verizon, and Charter Communications—have given more than \$1.2 million to the Republican members of Congress.

But the public will not be fooled. We stand strong for net neutrality. We call on the FCC and all those who contribute to this decision to honor the public will and maintain the 2015 rules for NET NEUTRALITY!
