Dear Ms. Searcy:

On December 1, 1992, Genevieve Morelli and Brad Mutschelknaus, representing the Competitive Telecommunications Association ("CompTel"), met with Greg Vogt, Colleen Boothby and Barbara Esbin of the Common Carrier Bureau along with other interested representatives of the telecommunications industry to discuss the CIID calling card transfer/compensation issue.

During this meeting, CompTel stated its position that operator service providers ("OSPs") deserve compensation for costs incurred in "transferring" calls to issuers of proprietary calling cards. CompTel pointed out that there appear to be three "transfer" options available to OSPs: (1) informing the caller that he or she must hang up and dial 10XXX; (2) Redirecting the call to the card issuer from the originating location; and (3) transferring the call from the OSP location to the card issuer. CompTel noted that the preferred transfer method varies depending on carrier networks, originating locations and the willingness of the transferee carrier to cooperate. CompTel added that the level of compensation should vary based upon which transfer method is utilized. Finally, CompTel stated that whichever compensation vehicle is selected, mandatory participation by AT&T is critical.


