

At the conclusion of the field hearing in this proceeding on November 20, 1992, counsel for Calvary Educational Broadcasting Network, Inc. I, Kevin T. Fisher, having been duly sworn, depose and say that:

1. I am a broadcasting consultant practicing in the City of Washington, District of Columbia; I am a member of the firm of Smith and Powstenko; and my qualifications are a matter of record before the Federal Communications Commission.

2. I have prepared this statement on behalf of CALVARY EDUCATIONAL BROADCASTING NETWORK, INC. ("Calvary"), as testimony for submission in the license hearing of KOKS(FM) in MM Docket No. 92-122.

3. I am the engineer responsible for the preparation of Calvary's Application for Construction Permit (BPED-870302MS) for a new Noncommercial FM Station on Channel 208C1 in Poplar Bluff, Missouri.

4. In preparing the application, and in response to Question 24 of FCC Form 340, Section V-B (attached as Figure 1), I reviewed the transfer location, plotted on a USGS 7-1/2' quadrangle (attached as Figure 2), in order to characterize the population surrounding the site as rural or urban. I subjectively characterized the area to be generally rural (*i.e.*, sparsely populated) based upon (a) the number of dwellings (shown on the map as small square or rectangular blocks where few dwellings exist, or as

a purple, red, or pink shaded area, which is urbanized and the number of dwellings to large to detail) and (b) the significant amount of forested area, shaded in green on the map.

5. In addition, I had prepared dozens of AM, FM, and television applications prior to my work for KOKS, including ones in which transmitter sites were located in heavily populated areas such as New York City, suburban Washington, and suburban Dallas.

6. Under these circumstances, I responded to Question 24 of FCC Form 346, Section V-B, stating that the issue of predicted blanketing interference did not apply with respect to the proposed operation, since I had determined that the area surrounding the transmitter site was sparsely populated.




