Pursuant to Section 1.1206 of the Federal Communications Commission's ("FCC" or "Commission") rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206, Clarity Products, LLC ("Clarity"), by its attorneys, hereby submits this letter summarizing an *ex parte* meeting in the above-referenced docket.

On September 14, 2019, Clarity's Beryl Bucher and Jamie van den Bergh gave a presentation to the iTRS Advisory Council in a closed session meeting in Phoenix, Arizona. Eliot Greenwald of the FCC was present at that meeting.

During the meeting, Clarity provided background about the company and discussed its innovative Automated Speech Recognition ("ASR") product, CaptionMate – describing how it works, available features and benefits, and the status of ongoing beta testing.

Clarity also directly addressed concerns and objections raised by other entities about ASR technology. Clarity explained that CaptionMate provides improved privacy, speed, and accuracy. Clarity further noted that independent testing of ASR technology has been completed by MITRE under the direction of the FCC.
