Dear Ms. Dortch:

T-Mobile US, Inc. (“T-Mobile”) hereby submits the second of its supplemental document productions, as well as follow up mapping data, in response to the FCC’s Information Request. The supplemental document production includes the second tranche of materials from non-priority custodians in response to the August 15, 2018, General Information and Document Request from the Federal Communications Commission (the “Commission”) in the above-referenced docket.¹ It consists of two hard drives containing the load files and production index associated with the document requests in the Information Request, containing items tagged as “Highly Confidential,” “Confidential,” and “Public,” per the Protective Order.² The mapping data is provided on a DVD classified as “Highly” confidential, and includes shapefiles by band and technology calculated using a -85 dBm RSSI. Pursuant to discussions with the FCC Transaction Team, T-Mobile is also providing a set of “equal power boundary” map shapefiles in lieu of the bandwidth specified in the shapefile format requested for Specification 20 of the Information Request.

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Pursuant to the procedures set forth in the Protective Order, a copy of the filing is being provided to the Secretary's Office, including the hard drives.³ In addition, two copies of the Highly Confidential Filing are being delivered to Kathy Harris, Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, with copies of the DVD.⁴ Copies of the hard drives are also being sent, by overnight mail, to the FCC's e-Discovery vendor. Finally, a copy of the Redacted Highly Confidential Filing is being filed electronically through the Commission's Electronic Comment Filing System.⁵
