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PETITION FOR SPECIAL RELIEF

I. INTRODUCTION AND SUMMARY.

Monongalia County, West Virginia and Preston County, West Virginia (together, the “Counties”) hereby submit this Petition for Special Relief to modify the television market of WBOY-TV¹ (the “Station”) to include the Counties as part of the station’s local television market with respect to satellite carriers DIRECTV and DISH Network.² Though located in West Virginia, the Counties have been “orphaned” by their assignment to the Pittsburgh, Pa. designated market area (“DMA”), which includes stations almost exclusively located in Pennsylvania – and none in West Virginia.³ Understandably, these stations focus their attention

on matters of importance to Pennsylvanians, leaving residents of the Counties without “local television programming . . . relevant to their everyday lives.”⁴ For instance, though West Virginia University is located in Morgantown, which is in Monongalia County, its residents who subscribe to DISH or DIRECTV are unable to find any significant coverage of their beloved Mountaineers. On that basis, the Counties are the communities Congress “sought to address” by “extending the market modification process” as part of the STELA Reauthorization Act of 2014 (“STELAR”).⁵ Adding the Counties to WBOY-TV’s local satellite television market would provide immediate access to West Virginia news, emergency coverage, weather, sports, politics, and other information.⁶ Not surprisingly, many residents have submitted comments supporting the modification, and Sen. Joe Manchin, Sen. Shelley Moore Capito, and Rep. David McKinley plan to submit a joint, bipartisan letter of support.

To meet Congress’s ends, the Commission gives “substantial weight” to the in-state programming a station proposes to bring to orphan counties.⁷ As described more fully herein, the petition satisfies the statutory test for market modification proceedings, and its grant would solve the orphan county problem in the Counties. Therefore, the Counties respectfully request that the Commission modify WBOY-TV’s local satellite television market without delay.

II. BACKGROUND

A. Congress Intended the STELAR Satellite Market Modification Process to Rectify “Orphan County” Situations like Monongalia and Preston Counties

Nielsen assigned Monongalia County and Preston County, which are both in West Virginia and located along the West Virginia-Pennsylvania border, to the Pittsburgh DMA. None of the stations in the Pittsburgh DMA have communities of license in West Virginia. Thus, the Counties are quintessential “orphan counties.”

“With the STELAR's revisions to the market modification process, and its addition of a satellite market modification process, Congress intended to address orphan county situations like these.”⁸ Orphan counties are those “served exclusively, or almost exclusively, by television stations coming from a neighboring state,” and therefore, “[s]atellite television subscribers residing in an orphan county often are not able to access their home state’s news, politics, sports, emergency information, and other programming.”⁹ In implementing STELAR, the Commission recognized that the “core purpose” of the new authority “is to promote consumer access to in-state and other relevant programming.”¹⁰ Indeed, STELAR added a new statutory factor specifically designed to remedy orphan county situation, which “permits the Commission to add communities to . . . a station’s local television market” in order “to better reflect market realities” and “to promote carriage of in-state and other relevant local television programming.”¹¹

In ruling on requests for satellite market modifications, the FCC “must afford particular attention to the value of localism” and “consider the plight” of consumers “who reside in DMAs that cross State lines” in accounting for the five factors presented in Section 338(l):¹²

- (1) whether the station, or other stations located in the same area—(a) have been historically carried on the cable system or systems within such community; and (b) have been historically carried on the satellite carrier or carriers serving such community;
- (2) whether the television station provides coverage or other local service to such community;
- (3) whether modifying the local market of the television station would promote consumers’ access to television broadcast station signals that originate in their State of residence;
- (4) whether any other television station that is eligible to be carried by a satellite carrier in such community in fulfillment of the requirements of this section provides news coverage of issues of concern to such community or provides carriage or coverage of sporting and other events of interest to the community; and
- (5) evidence of viewing patterns in households that subscribe and do not subscribe to the services offered by multichannel video programming distributors within the areas served by such multichannel video programming distributors in such community.¹³

Specifically, “in line with Congress’ addition of the new third statutory factor, in orphan county situations [the FCC] will give substantial weight to the local/in-state programming a petitioner proposes to bring to the orphan county when determining whether a nexus to a new community has been demonstrated, and will consider the other factors, when they apply, as enhancements to a petitioner’s case.”¹⁴

III. WBOY-TV MEETS THE STATUTORY TEST FOR MARKET MODIFICATION

A. Carriage of WBOY-TV is Technically and Economically Feasible for DIRECTV and DISH Network

As a threshold matter, the Commission “will not grant a market modification petition if the resulting carriage would be infeasible.”¹⁵ Therefore, the Counties submit as Exhibits A and B Feasibility Certifications from the satellite carriers demonstrating that carriage of WBOY-TV is feasible.

B. Factor 1: Historic Carriage of WBOY-TV Enhances the Weight in Favor of the Petition

If a petition provides evidence of historic carriage of a station in an orphan county, it serves “as an enhancement factor.”¹⁶ Here, the long-time carriage of WBOY-TV by cable systems in the Counties provides substantial enhancement to the instant petition. Exhibit G shows WBOY-TV has been carried consistently in both Preston and Monongalia Counties. Therefore, the historic carriage factor weighs heavily in favor of granting the Petition.

C. Factor 2: WBOY-TV Provides Extensive Local Programming to the Counties

WBOY-TV, licensed to Clarksburg, W. Va. and an NBC and ABC affiliate, serves central West Virginia, including the Counties, with a wide range of local news, sports, weather, and other information programming.¹⁷ The Commission expressly notes that “in-state programming is a type of ‘local’ service [I]n-state stations are more likely to demonstrate that they are ‘local’ through evidence showing they seek to provide a community with access to

news, politics, sports, emergency and other programming specifically related to their home state.”¹⁸

WBOY-TV has a long history of providing extensive local programming to the Counties. The Station simulcasts local news weekdays on both feeds from 5-7:00 am, noon, and 11:00 pm, while WBOY-TV 12.1 airs news at 5:00 pm and WBOY-TV 12.2 airs news at 6:00pm. WBOY-TV 12.1 also airs “West Virginia Tonight” weekdays at 5:30 pm. and weekend newscasts at 6:00 pm and 11:00 pm.¹⁹ Exhibit C conclusively demonstrates that WBOY-TV dedicates itself to providing its viewers with the highest quality local news and entertainment services and in-depth coverage pertinent to West Virginians and residents of the Counties. For instance, the Station covers state politics, with stories on the state budget, which was highly contentious, led to cutbacks in major state-funded programs, and highlighted political differences between the state legislature and Governor; and efforts within the state to fight drug trafficking and the opioid epidemic.²⁰

Moreover, the Station brings stories from Capitol Hill home with a West Virginia focus, with numerous pieces providing the positions, viewpoints and justifications of West Virginia’s Senators and Representatives on national issues such ranging from the healthcare debate and how it might affect West Virginia’s expansion of the Medicaid program, to the inclusion of Coal Miners’ benefits in a federal spending bill, to the announcement of town halls, where citizens can engage with their elected representatives.²¹

West Virginia University's flagship campus is located in Morgantown, West Virginia, which is the county seat and largest city in Monongalia County. Naturally, given the intense local interest, the Station provides extensive coverage of West Virginia University ("WVU") and its beloved athletic teams. In fact, WBOY-TV operates a bureau in Morgantown. Illustrative stories include news about a WVU student developing a digital advocacy application to make it easier for residents to be politically active, the WVU Board of Governors approving the University's 2017-2018 budget which raised tuition and fees an average of 5%, and, of course, the latest news on league standings, wins and losses, and recruitment for WVU's football, basketball, and baseball teams.²² Further, the Station regularly covers high school sports in the Counties. When considering requests for a market modification, "[t]he Commission has long recognized the importance to subscribers of having viewing access to in-state sports."²³

The Station also provides extensive coverage specific to the Counties themselves. In July, the Station was on the ground to cover the clean-up after devastating flooding occurred, for which the National Guard was called into service to assist.²⁴ Other stories specific to the Counties include human interest pieces, such as interviews with volunteers and participants at the "Relay for Life," coverage of accidents, crime sprees, and arrests, road closures and other traffic issues, and economic development projects.²⁵

In addition, dozens of consumer comments provided in Exhibit D support the proposed market modification. The Commission has held that such comments "can help demonstrate a

station's nexus to the community at issue.”²⁶ Here, the nexus is clear. For instance, Nora Montgomery wrote that she doesn't “live in PA and their news doesn't pertain to me. I want to know what is going on in my state.”²⁷ Kenny Farrell highlighted that a failure to “receive vital important weather condition updates” impacted his “family's safety.”²⁸ Angie Blankenship echoed this sentiment, writing that “[t]he other day we were in a tornado watch and I didn't even know it because the Pittsburgh channels were focused on PA. I'm concerned about staying up to date this winter and protecting my family.”²⁹ These comments show the importance of West Virginia-specific programming to our residents.

Residents in the Counties also miss out on coverage of their beloved hometown Mountaineers. For example, Josh White wrote that “[t]here are several WVU sporting events including men's basketball games, baseball games, and the spring football game that are aired on local WV stations that are not aired by any Pittsburgh channels. Thus, people living in Mon[ongalia] County miss sporting events for the state flagship university and local economic driver. . . . This is unacceptable.”³⁰

The Commission has made clear that evidence of geographic proximity is not determinative, but can be an “enhancement” if provided, in orphan county market modification proceedings. With that in mind, Exhibit E shows that the noise-limited service contour map of WBOY-TV covers the entirety of the Counties.

Additionally, Exhibit F demonstrates that WBOY-TV's community of license is about a

45-minute drive to Morgantown, the county seat of Monongalia County, and a little more than an hour to Kingwood, the county seat of Preston County. By extension, U.S. Census Bureau commuting patterns show that more than 500 Harrison County residents commute to Monongalia County, and more than 700 commute from Monongalia County to Lewis and Harrison Counties combined.³¹

The Station's provision of a multitude of "local" programming -- "programming originating from and about" West Virginia, the myriad consumer and government official comments, and the geographic proximity enhancement factors weigh heavily in favor of the petition.³²

D. Factor 3: Adding the Counties to WBOY-TV's Local Market Will Increase Access to In-State Stations

As set forth above, WBOY-TV is licensed to Clarksburg, West Virginia, which is in the same state as Monongalia County, West Virginia and Preston County, West Virginia. According to the Commission, "a petitioner will be afforded credit for satisfying this factor simply by showing that the involved station is licensed to a community within the same state as the new community."³³ For that reason, the petition satisfies this factor.

In addition, the factor "weighs more heavily in favor of modification if the petitioner shows that the involved station provides programming specifically related to subscribers' state of residence."³⁴ As provided in the section above, WBOY-TV provides extensive programming for

and about West Virginians. Meanwhile, given that fewer than five percent of the TV Households in the Pittsburgh DMA live in West Virginia,³⁵ the stations in the Pittsburgh DMA provide little-to-no programming geared toward West Virginians, and when they do, it is through a Pittsburgh- or Pennsylvania-centric lens. Therefore, this factor weighs heavily in favor of the petition.

E. Factor 4: Other Local Stations

Located far from Pittsburgh and in a separate state, the Counties receive limited local programming from stations in their current DMA. For instance, David McCormick, Jr. wrote “We don’t live in Pittsburgh. We don’t live in Pennsylvania. We cannot currently get local channels. No local weather. No local sports. No local news.”³⁶ Melanie Waggett wrote that she “[n]ever understood why we got Pittsburgh [news] when we live in Morgantown. I would like to hear the news of where I live and not in [Pittsburgh].” She “miss[es] out on community announcements” and doesn’t “get to see Mountaineer highlights!”³⁷

That said, even assuming *arguendo* that those stations did provide some local programming, “this factor neither weighs against nor in favor of [the] modification request.”³⁸

IV. CONCLUSION

Congress sought to remedy orphan county situations like Monongalia and Preston when it passed the satellite market modification provision in STELAR. The Petition sets forth substantial evidence demonstrating a substantial nexus between the WBOY-TV and the Counties. Therefore, the Commission should grant the request for market modification and order the addition of the Counties to the local market of WBOY-TV on both DIRECTV and DISH Network.

DIRECTV's engineering staff was given the areas to evaluate for stations **WDTV, WNPB, WVFX, and WBOY** on our **Clarksburg-Weston, WV** spot beam, and have found that:

- DIRECTV's HD spot beam covers **all** current zip codes in **Monongalia County**

Please note that the Clarksburg-Weston, WV DMA, the home DMA for these four stations, has only an HD spot beam for local channels, and customers must have HD equipment in order to receive local stations. As a result, only Monongalia County customers with HD equipment would be able to receive these four stations, should this market modification petition be granted. Customers with SD equipment would need to obtain HD equipment in order to receive these additional channels.



FEASIBILITY CERTIFICATION PURSUANT TO 47 C.F.R § 76.59(e)

1. This Feasibility Certification is issued by DISH Network L.L.C. (“DISH”) pursuant to the pre-filing coordination procedures contained in the Federal Communications Commission’s (“FCC”) Order¹ governing market modifications for satellite carriers under the STELA Reauthorization Act of 2014 (“STELAR”).²
2. This Feasibility Certification responds to the letter (“Letter”) dated December 19, 2016 from the Preston County Commission requesting information regarding carriage of local broadcast stations from the Clarksburg, West Virginia designated market area (“DMA”) into Preston County (the “County”).
3. DISH provides the high definition (“HD”) Clarksburg local broadcast stations (“Clarksburg Locals”) from a spot beam on a satellite located at the 61.5° W.L. orbital slot, and provides the standard definition (“SD”) Clarksburg Locals from a spot beam on a satellite located at the 129° W.L. orbital slot.
4. The ability of an individual DISH subscriber in the County to receive the Clarksburg Locals from DISH depends on, among other things, how the subscriber’s individual satellite antenna was originally installed and pointed, and whether that subscriber is predicted to have adequate spot beam coverage from the satellite that carries the stations.
5. In general, a DISH customer’s satellite antenna, when installed, is pointed so that it can receive satellite signals from specific orbital slots. Receiving service from orbital slots not planned for in the original equipment installation at the subscriber’s home typically would require DISH to send a truck and technician to adjust equipment or install different equipment, which would impose a very substantial cost burden on DISH.
6. The relevant spot beams from the two satellites that carry both the HD and SD Clarksburg Locals adequately cover the County. But, not all DISH subscribers in the County will be able to receive the Clarksburg Locals with their currently installed satellite dishes and set-top boxes (“STBs”).
7. Only approximately 60 percent of DISH subscribers in the County could receive the HD version of the Clarksburg Locals with their current satellite dish and STB(s). Approximately 20 percent of DISH’s subscribers in the County could receive the SD version of the Clarksburg Locals with their current satellite dish and STB(s), but would require a service call and different STB(s) in order to receive the HD Clarksburg Locals. And approximately 20 percent of DISH’s subscribers in the County would require a service call, a different satellite dish antenna, and different STB(s) in order to receive

8. In addition, DISH would need to parse its subscribers in the County into different groups depending on whether they receive service calls and equipment changes to enable them to receive the Clarksburg Locals. DISH would need to make, among other things, operational and billing changes in an attempt to manage these different cases. And attempting to target the provision of the Clarksburg Locals to the subset of DISH subscribers in the County who might be able to receive them would cause customer confusion and frustration. For example, one DISH subscriber might be able to receive the Clarksburg Locals while her neighbor could not. This, in turn, could lead to a poor customer service experience and a burden on DISH if a subscriber requested to have a technician sent to install equipment at DISH's expense in order to receive service from a different orbital location.
9. As a result, DISH has determined that it would be, at least, both "technically infeasible" and "economically infeasible" pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 76.59(e) for DISH to provide the Clarksburg Locals to the approximately 20 percent of the County that cannot receive either the HD or SD versions of the Clarksburg Locals with their current equipment. In addition, it would be, at least, "economically infeasible" pursuant to 47 C.F.R. § 76.59(e) for DISH to accommodate customer requests for service visits and equipment upgrades for subscribers desiring to receive HD Clarksburg Locals when they could otherwise receive only the SD Clarksburg Locals.
10. To the extent that a Clarksburg, WV local broadcast station impacted by a market modification elects retransmission consent with respect to DISH for carriage of its station in the County, DISH cannot be certain whether it will be able to successfully reach an agreement with the station. If DISH is unable to reach a retransmission consent agreement with a given station, it will be impossible for DISH to provide that station's signal into the County. If any one of the Stations were to deny DISH the right to retransmit its signal into the County, it may be either technically or economically infeasible,³ or both, for DISH to launch a customer offering with only the remaining stations that did grant retransmission consent.
11. As DISH noted in its comments during the development of the market modification rules,⁴ an FCC grant of a market modification could result in, among other things, two different stations affiliated with the same broadcast network being authorized for satellite local-into-local carriage in the County. This could result in DISH being required to pay retransmission consent fees twice for the same broadcast network. Therefore, we must reserve the right to charge additional fees to subscribers in the County who elect to







Hi,

I am writing in support of the Mon County resolution to make Clarksburg-Weston broadcast channels available as local home market channels for Mon County on satellite (DBS) services such as DirecTV and Dish Network. I have been a DirecTV subscriber in Morgantown WV for over 4 years (started May 2013) and the fact that the satellite providers are required to carry Pittsburgh only stations (and are not allowed to carry any WV stations except those currently classified as "significantly viewed" due to FCC regulations) since Mon County is classified by Nielsen in the Pittsburgh DMA is ridiculous & harmful for several reasons.

1. The primary reason is the lack of local & state news coverage. The Pittsburgh stations almost never cover local news & events happening in WV. In my 6.5+ years of living in the Mon County area, I have seen a Pittsburgh news truck in the Mon County area once. The extent of the Pittsburgh stations daily coverage of Mon County is to highlight the current and future temperatures/weather forecast on the giant map that shows the entire region. Frankly, I don't blame them (the Pittsburgh stations) for the lack of coverage because Pittsburgh is a huge region and why would they spend the limited amount of time they have each night on an area that is 1.5 hours/70 miles away in a different state. However, that doesn't mean that we as satellite customers should have to suffer because of this. Thus, the Clarksburg-Weston stations should be changed to be considered home stations for Mon County so that residents can get local & state news on television which they currently are not receiving.

2. Another reason is the lack of West Virginia University (WVU) sports coverage that exist for DirecTV/Dish subscribers in Mon County. There are several WVU sporting events including men's basketball games, baseball games, and the spring football game that are aired on local WV stations that are not aired by any Pittsburgh channels. Thus, people living in Mon County, miss sporting events for the state flagship university and local economic driver yet people in every other county in all other parts of the state (many living hours away) are able to watch these events that those who live minutes from the events cannot. This is unacceptable.

3. Related to #2 above, starting with 2013, the University of Pittsburgh (Pitt), ACC, & West Virginia University (WVU), Big 12 were located in different collegiate conferences. Thus, there are now conflicts for college football games when there are ACC & Big 12 games not involving Pitt and/or ACC games involving Pitt. For example, at noon on a Saturday, there may be an ACC football game between Florida State-Boston College and a Big 12 football game between Kansas State-Texas Tech. ABC decides to air a split national telecast with some part of the country receiving one game on ABC (and the other game can only be viewed online at ESPN3.com) and vice versa for the other part of the country. The Big 12 game is more relevant to Mon County due to WVU's membership in the Big 12. However, WTAE (4.1, the current Pittsburgh ABC affiliate) will air the ACC game since that game is of more importance to Pitt; thus, WVU fans in Mon County can only watch the Kansas St-Texas Tech game online (or not at all possibly) and are stuck watching a game that has much less relevance via their satellite subscription.

Similarly, there is a regionally syndicated game called the "ACC Network Game of the Week" that airs each Saturday generally at 12:20 PM. WTAE is the Pittsburgh station that has chosen to air this game but often airs it on its digital subchannel 4.2 (This-TV) which DirecTV does not carry. However, whenever this game features Pitt, the game is always aired on WTAE (4.1). Thus, whatever game is scheduled to be aired on ABC (nationally or regionally) gets moved to This-TV (4.2), but this means that anyone with DirecTV is unable to watch it since DirecTV does not carry This-TV; the game would only be viewable online via ESPN3. Therefore, there have been situations where ABC has been scheduled to air a game featuring Big 12 teams but because Pitt was playing in the ACC Network Game of the Week, fans in Mon County were not able to watch the Big 12 game, or could only watch it online. These problems did not exist prior to 2012 (when WVU joined the Big 12) because Pitt & WVU were both in the same conference. However, now that they are in different conferences, it only makes sense that residents of Mon County/WVU fans receive WV local channels so that they can watch games with fellow conference teams on their DirecTV/Dish service instead of being forced to watch them online, or in some cases not being able to watch them at all.

For the reasons stated I above, I strongly support the resolution passed by the Mon County Commission and look forward to hopefully receiving Clarksburg-Weston WV local channels in the future as part of my DirecTV subscription.
