
Dear Mr. Stockdale and Ms. Harris:

The Attorney General of the State of Tennessee (the "Attorney General") is conducting an inquiry into whether the proposed acquisition of Sprint Corporation by T-Mobile US, Inc. would violate any federal and/or Tennessee state laws. In connection with this investigation, the Attorney General is seeking access to documents and information that contain Numbering Resource Utilization and Forecast ("NRUF") data and local number portability ("LNP") data pursuant to its authority under Tenn. Code Ann. § 47-25-101 et seq. ("Tennessee Trade Practices Act").

The Attorney General shall not divulge any documents or information it receives pursuant to its authority under the Tennessee Trade Practices Act except in connection with a legitimate law enforcement purpose or a judicial proceeding. Additionally, if any documents or information we receive pursuant should become the subject of a discovery request or public records request by a third party, the Attorney General shall assert all privileges, exemptions from, or other objections to disclosure in response to such request that the Attorney General in good faith deems appropriate under applicable law, including but not limited to Tenn. Code Ann. § 10-7-504(a)(5)(A)(ii) which protects the confidentiality of any the books, records or other materials related to investigations conducted by federal law enforcement or federal regulatory agencies, which are confidential or privileged under federal law.

In connection with this investigation, the Attorney General is seeking access to documents and information that contain Numbering Resource Utilization and Forecast ("NRUF") data and local number portability ("LNP") data pursuant to its authority under Wis. Stat. §133.03, Wisconsin's antitrust statute.

The Attorney General shall not divulge any documents or information it receives pursuant to its authority under Wis. Stat. §133.03 except in connection with a legitimate law enforcement purpose or a judicial proceeding. Additionally, if any documents or information we receive pursuant should become the subject of a discovery request or public records request by a third party, the Attorney General shall assert all privileges, exemptions from, or other objections to disclosure in response to such request that the Attorney General in good faith deems appropriate under applicable law, including but not limited to Wis. Stat. §19.36(2), which protects the confidentiality of records of federal law enforcement or federal regulatory agencies that are confidential or privileged under federal law.
