**MASS MEDIA BUREAU'S COMMENTS ON  
JOINT REQUEST FOR APPROVAL OF SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT  
AND RELATED PLEADINGS**

1. On December 28, 1992, Russ Robinson ("Robinson") and Urban Network Communications ("Urban") filed a joint request for approval of settlement agreement. Also on December 28, 1992, Robinson filed a petition for leave to amend and amendment, a motion to delete issue and a contingent petition for leave to amend and amendment. The Mass Media Bureau submits the following consolidated comments with respect to these pleadings.

2. The proposed settlement agreement contemplates the dismissal of Urban's application, in return for consideration totalling \$24,768 from Robinson, and grant of Robinson's application. Grant of Robinson's application is contingent upon favorable resolution of the contingent environmental issue specified against him in the Hearing Designation Order ("HDO"), 7

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
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
FCC Rcd 7966 (1992). In response to the directive in the HDO concerning his environmental showing, Robinson has filed an amendment addressing the noted deficiency which has been served upon the Chief, Audio Services Division. On December 30, 1992, the Assistant Chief, Audio Services Division, advised the Presiding Judge that Robinson's amendment satisfied the requirements of 47 C.F.R. §1.1311 and that deletion of the contingent environmental issue is warranted. Robinson's contingent petition for leave to amend and amendment seeks to withdraw his integration and divestiture pledges, consistent with the Commission's Memorandum Opinion and Order, 6 FCC Rcd 3403 (1991) and Ruarch Associates, 103 FCC 2d 1178 (1986).

3. Review of the settlement agreement, including the declarations of Robinson and a principal of Urban, shows that Robinson and Urban have complied with the requirements of Section 73.3525 of the Commission's Rules, which implements Section 311(c)(3) of the Communications Act of 1934, as amended. Robinson and Urban show that their applications were not filed for an improper purpose and that approval of the joint request will serve the public interest. Additionally, Urban has demonstrated that it is entitled to the requested consideration since it has demonstrated legitimate and prudent expenses totalling \$24,768 in the preparation, prosecution and filing of its application.

4. Based on the foregoing, the Bureau supports grant of the joint request, approval of the settlement agreement, dismissal of the Urban application and reimbursement in the requested amount, deletion of the contingent environmental issue and grant of the Robinson application.

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
