Tri-Co Technologies, LLC d/b/a Crosslake Communications (the "Company" or "Crosslake") hereby provides notice that it intends to cease offering wireline broadband Internet access transmission service on a tariffed basis. Effective January 1, 2017, the Company will begin offering wireline broadband Internet access transmission service on a Title II, common-carriage, permissive de-tariffed basis pursuant to paragraphs 90 and 94 of the Commission's Wireline Broadband Order.<sup>1</sup> The geographic areas affected by this notice are Crosslake's exchanges where wireline broadband Internet access transmission services are technically feasible.

Today, this service is provided to Crosslake's ISP division. The ISP purchases wireline broadband access transmission service for use as a wholesale input to its broadband Internet access services, which are sold by the ISP to residential and business customers. End user services will not be affected by the discontinuance of the tariffed offering by the Company. As stated in the attached customer notice, Crosslake will continue to offer existing ISP customers wireline broadband Internet access transmission service pursuant to current rates, terms and conditions until the end of their current term or upon replacement with a Broadband commercial agreement. Crosslake's rates, terms and conditions for its permissively de-tariffed wireline broadband access transmission service will be available at its office located at 35910 County Road 66, Crosslake, MN 56442 and on its website at [www.crosslake.net](http://www.crosslake.net).
