On October 30, 2017, representatives from CTIA and our member companies met with staff from the Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, Office of Engineering and Technology, and International Bureau to discuss the above-captioned proceedings. A full list of meeting participants is attached to this filing.

During the meeting, CTIA emphasized the importance of maintaining the compromise sharing framework for the 28 GHz and 37-39 GHz bands that the Commission adopted in the 2016 *Spectrum Frontiers Order*. Consistent with its prior advocacy, CTIA also highlighted the need to make significant blocks of spectrum available for licensed terrestrial mobile use to facilitate 5G mobile broadband networks and services.
