This is a "Letter For a Waiver of the 60 day time to file an appeal for 471 App 171008662. The applications were denied during the Summer Deferral period on 09/1/2017. The application should not have been denied as the applicant/consultant was not given a proper opportunity to submit the basic information that was requested – The reviewer was unable to make successful contact to obtain the enclosed basic information. In addition, due to various system issues, outages and maint., we were

unable to file the appeal after the end of the Summer Deferral period and by the end of the 60 day time to file an appeal as due to EPC issues. In addition, certain similar applications like application 161036762 were approved without having responses submitted or requested which illustrates inconsistent procedures being administered.

Therefore, since the application should not have been denied and the EPC system should have been more reliable and accessible that the enclosed information should be accepted. Please accept this appeal which only a day late due to the issues raised above so that the school is not penalized.

I believe that the intent of the program is to make sure all eligible schools and libraries receive phone, internet access and internal networking equipment maintenance services as well as internal networking equipment. This school should not be penalized due to any delays in providing requested information which was beyond their control. I sincerely hope that this material will be reviewed and the application reviewed on the information previously provided.
