Thank you for considering those of us who appreciate the conference line. I am a 69 year old lupus patient. My husband is semi-retired with a limited income. I have a shut-in life. My family goes to church services and I have been grateful to listen to the services over the conference line here at home.

When there have been weddings, funerals and ordinations I listen in as well. It has been a big blessing in my life.

I also listen to the handicapped singing and recorded experiences of other handicapped folk as I can. This has been less, however, because I want to respect the wishes of our local phone company. They want me to restrict my use of long distance.

We do not wish to make a hardship for the phone companies. We understand they have expenses to maintain and repair phone lines. They have to "make ends meet", too.

Our mothers are 92 and 95 years old and live in Washington State. I am thankful to at least talk with them on the phone as I will likely - unless it is a miracle from God - not see them again on earth. These calls add to my long distance minutes, too. We also receive prayer requests over the phone, too.

We do not have internet, tv, or radio in our home and I am unable to go to the library to use the internet.

I have a blind friend whose feeling in her hands is mostly gone. She cannot therefore use braille. She often uses the phone as well.

Also there are many young mothers in our church circles who are glad for the church services on the conference line when they have to stay home with sick children. Others we know of are aged and infirm and listen in as well.

It truly is "the next best thing to being there" and is a comfort to us in the grief over our limitations.

You are in our prayers as you consider this matter. We trust that God will meet our needs even if we need to go back to the "old fashioned" days without the use of phones. (1 Peter ch. 5:7)
