Re: CC Docket No. 92-77, Phase I, Compliance Plan

Dear Mr. Castellano:

On November 6, 1992, the Commission released a Report and Order and Request for Supplemental Comment in CC Docket No. 92-77, Phase I, in which AT&T was directed to educate its cardholders to check public phone notices and to use 0+ access only at public phones identified as presubscribed to AT&T, and to provide clear and accurate access code dialing instructions on every proprietary calling card issued. The Commission further required AT&T to make its 800 access number easier to use, and to submit its plan for implementation of this requirements within 30 days from the release of the Order. The Commission delegated to the Common Carrier Bureau the authority to review these materials and order any necessary changes in content. ¹

AT&T submitted to the Bureau initial drafts of the materials in its plan of compliance on November 23, 1992. The proposed plan itself was filed in Docket 92-77 on December 23, 1992, and later amended in certain respects by your Ex Parte letters to Ms. Donna Searcy dated January 28, 1993, and January 29, 1993.

We have reviewed AT&T's plan of compliance, as amended, and have determined that it complies with the requirements set forth in the 0+ Order. The plan, as amended, is hereby approved. We order that AT&T fully accomplish implementation of its plan as proposed and modified.
