On November 3, 2017, Scott Bergmann and Kara Graves of CTIA; Stacey Black of AT&T; James Goldstein of Sprint; John Hunter of T-Mobile; and Charla Rath of Verizon met with Rachael Bender of the Office of Chairman Ajit Pai to discuss the above-captioned proceedings.

During the meeting, CTIA emphasized the importance of maintaining the compromise sharing framework for the 28 GHz and 37-39 GHz bands that the Commission adopted in the 2016 *Spectrum Frontiers Order*. Consistent with its prior advocacy, CTIA also highlighted the need to make significant blocks of spectrum available for licensed terrestrial mobile use to facilitate 5G mobile broadband networks and services.
