Re: *Notice of ex parte presentation - Connect USVI Stage 2 Support
WC Docket No. 18-143*

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 5, 2018, ATN International, Inc. (“ATN”), on behalf of itself and its U.S. Virgin Islands (“USVI”) subsidiaries Viya and Viya Wireless, met with Sue McNeil, Rebekah Douglas, and Talmage Cox of the Wireline Competition Bureau to discuss Connect USVI Fund Stage 2 support in connection with the above-referenced docket.¹ In the meeting, ATN was represented by Douglas J. Minster, Vice President, Government and Regulatory Affairs; Rohan Ranaraja, Director, Regulatory Affairs; and outside counsel Phillip R. Marchesiello and the undersigned.

In the meeting, ATN thanked the Commission for all of its work in responding quickly and decisively to Hurricanes Irma and Maria. ATN also provided an update on Viya’s network restoration efforts. Viya has restored voice and broadband service to all locations that Viya served on its hybrid fiber-coaxial (“HFC”) network prior to the storms where there is still a customer or potential customer. ATN noted that it has spent over \$80 million on Viya’s hurricane restoration efforts, only a small portion of which was covered by the Stage 1 funding already issued by the Commission. ATN also discussed the importance of sufficient and stable universal service support in a territory such as the USVI where the costs of providing service are high and the economic conditions are challenging. As a result, ATN and Viya have had to defer

decisions about further hardening and extension of its network pending resolution of this proceeding.

Consistent with its comments and reply comments in this proceeding, ATN explained that the most effective and expeditious way to bring the Stage 2 Connect USVI funding to bear to benefit the people of the USVI would be to provide the funding to Viya—the sole incumbent local exchange carrier charged with serving the USVI in its entirety as the carrier of last resort, and the sole operator of a Territory-wide wireline broadband network.² ATN also discussed the enormous differences between the USVI and Puerto Rico markets, which differences warrant different, tailored approaches to the allocation of Stage 2 support in each Territory.³

This letter is filed consistent with the Commission's ex parte rules.
