Re: NPRM 92-235 regarding 72 Mhz and 75 Mhz frequencies

Gentlemen:

Your Notice of Proposed Rule Making in PR Docket 92-235 replaces Part 90 with a new Part 88, which would allow mobile users to use frequencies within 2.5 KHz of frequencies currently in use by radio controlled (R/C) model enthusiasts.

This action will have a potentially severe effect upon my son and myself and the entire R/C hobby industry. If put into effect, our airplanes could easily be shot out of the sky by a mobile user we'd have no way of knowing about. This would create a disastrous situation in which physical injury, perhaps fatal, and property damage could occur.

My son and I have been involved in this hobby for more than a year. We have invested in expensive equipment meeting current safety standards, using the existing frequencies and standards established by the FCC.

I urge you to reconsider this proposal. Keep 10 KHz spacing between all frequencies on the 75 and 72 Mhz bands available for safe use by R/C enthusiasts.

Thank you for your careful consideration of our objections.
