The three community access channels in Northbridge are very important to us in this town. All three channels, public, education and government channels are in constant use and have been in existence for over 30 years. In 2009 we formed Northbridge Community Television Inc., A 501(c)(3) charitable non-profit. Our community TV staff, Board of Directors, volunteers, and our school system have all contributed to the success of our organization. We are leading in volunteer involvement and the sheer volume of productions coming out of this facility compared to any surrounding town. If these rules are passed by the FCC it will shut down our channels, outreach and destroy our mission to bring our community together through community television. If by chance we do survive, which is not expected as our budget is very small, Charter Spectrum can expect bills from our community television channels for carrying our content which till now has been completely free to the cable giant. Gone are the days when we Charter and NCTV were a team with the same goal. Shameful corporate community crushing behavior on Charter Spectrum's part. The regulations should be protecting the community channels instead of eliminating them.
