

Dear Ms. Dortch:

On November 13, 2019, Christopher Guttman-McCabe of CGM Advisors, on behalf of Anterix, Inc., (“Anterix”), and Lance Johnson of Anterix met with Giulia McHenry, Acting Chief of the Office of Economics and Analytics, Craig Bomberger, Patrick DeGraba, and Paul Lafontaine all of the Office of Economics and Analytics. Mr. Guttman-McCabe and Mr. Johnson updated the OEA team on the continuously expanding utility and private enterprise interest in the 900 MHz band, including the Commission's grant of a fifth experimental license with more experimental license applications likely on the way. The parties discussed the benefits of addressing the concerns of the incumbent railroads in the band, as well as the process by which a broadband license would be granted, and how spectrum in the band would be realigned including the use of spectrum licensed to Anterix outside of the proposed broadband allocation. The parties also discussed Anterix's support for a “success threshold” as proposed in the Commission's NPRM to address any potential holdouts, and its support of the “complex system” proposal.

This letter is being filed electronically, in accordance with Section 1.1206(b) of the Commission's Rules, 47 C.F.R. § 1.1206(b), for inclusion in the record in this proceeding.
