JOINT MOTION FOR SUSPENSION OF PROCEDURAL DATES

Barbara Brindisi ("Brindisi") and Lauryn Broadcasting Corporation ("Lauryn"), jointly and by their counsel, hereby respectfully request that the procedural dates in the above-identified proceeding be suspended pending the imminent submission of a settlement agreement and the ultimate approval of that agreement. 1/ In support whereof, the following is shown.

Brindisi and Lauryn have agreed in principle to a settlement arrangement pursuant to which Brindisi would pay Lauryn consideration in the amount of \$5,000 in exchange for the dismissal of Lauryn's application. It is anticipated that

1/ On February 19, 1993, Kay Sadlier-Gill filed a Petition for Leave to Amend and a related Motion for Severance and Grant of her application. Upon the grant of those pleadings, the Sadlier-Gill application will not be a factor in this proceeding. Brindisi and Lauryn assume that Sadlier-Gill's motions will be granted and that their agreement would then result in a universal settlement of this proceeding.

Brindisi's application could then be granted. The parties expect that this agreement, along with the appropriate pleadings and documentation, will be submitted within the next week or ten days.

Given these circumstances, it would appear to be an unnecessary expenditure of the resources of the parties and of the Commission to continue the procedural mechanisms of this proceeding. Nonetheless, the following procedural deadlines are near at hand:

March 16, 1993:	Lauryn's reponse due to Brindisi's Petition to Enlarge the Issues filed March 1, 1993.
March 31, 1993:	Depositions scheduled.
April 1, 1993:	Preliminary engineering exhibits due to be exchanged.

Having agreed in principle to settle this case, the parties believe that it would be in the public interest to curtail the litigation so as to permit the parties to focus on the details of their settlement agreement and to allow them to conserve their resources for more productive purposes.

Good cause having been shown, Brindisi and Lauryn respectfully move for a suspension of the procedural deadlines in this proceeding pending the approval of their proposed settlement agreement.
