of the Commission's Rules for The Domestic  
Public Fixed Radio Services.

OCOM Corporation ("OCOM") provides interexchange common carrier services as well as private line services in the states of Indiana and Ohio using its microwave network, which currently consists of 136 point-to-point common carrier microwave radio stations. As such, OCOM is vitally interested in seeing that the rules proposed in CC Docket 93-2 are implemented.

OCOM commends the FCC for recognizing that public demand for a wider range of microwave services and swifter delivery of those services make it necessary that present rules be amended. OCOM fully supports the Commission's proposals for pre-grant construction of Point-to-Point Microwave Radio Service ("PPMS") facilities. These rules will increase the effectiveness of PPMS providers and enable them to more efficiently compete in today's world of telecommunication services and thus better serve the public. As the Commission has found in connection with its cellular rules, 47 C.F.R. Part 22, these proposals will provide for greater license flexibility and responsiveness in providing service to the public.

For these same reasons, the proposed pre-grant construction rules should apply to modifications of existing facilities pursuant to Sections 21.40 and 21.41 of the Commission's Rules.


