Gentlemen:

This is with respect to your above-captioned application for a new noncommercial educational television station to operate on Channel 39, Bakersfield, California.

On July 16, 1986, the Commission imposed a "freeze" on applications for new television stations within the minimum co-channel separation distances from 30 designated television markets. Advanced Television Systems, Mimeo No. 4074 (released July 17, 1987) (hereafter referred to as the "Freeze Order"). The "freeze" was imposed because the high densities of existing television stations in those markets limited the spectrum available for advanced television ("ATV") service there, and the Commission wanted to preserve its spectrum allocation options for ATV use. One of the listed cities is Los Angeles, California. Consequently, all new UHF proposals for communities within 174.5 miles (280.8 km) of Los Angeles are subject to the "freeze". Since Bakersfield is 101.3
