

9. REMOVAL OF DIRECTORS

Any or all of the directors may be removed for cause by vote of the members or by action of the board. Directors may be removed without cause only by vote of the members.

10. RESIGNATION

A director may resign at any time by giving written notice to the board, the directors or the secretary of the association. Unless otherwise specified in the notice, the board or such officer receiving such resignation taking effect, and the acceptance of the resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.

11. COMPENSATION

No compensation shall be paid to directors, as such, for their services, but by resolution of the board a fixed sum and expenses for actual attendance at each regular or special meeting of the board may be authorized. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to preclude any director from serving the foundation in any other capacity and receiving compensation therefor.

12. PRESUMPTION OF ASSENT

A director of the foundation who is present at a meeting of the directors at which action on any corporate matter is taken shall be presumed to have assented to the action taken unless his dissent shall be entered in the minutes of the meeting or unless he shall file his written dissent to such action with the person acting as the secretary

ARTICLE IV - OFFICERS

1. NUMBER

The officers of the foundation shall be directors, president, vice-president, and secretary-treasurer, each of whom shall be elected by the directors. Such other officers and assistant officers as may be deemed necessary may be elected or appointed by the directors.

2. ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE

The officers of the foundation to be elected by the directors shall be elected annually at the first meeting of the directors held after each annual meeting of the members. Each officer shall hold office until his successor shall have been duly elected and shall have qualified or until his death or until he shall resign or shall have been removed in the manner hereinafter provided.

3. REMOVAL

Any officer or agent elected or appointed by the directors may be removed by the directors whenever in their judgement the best interests of the foundation would be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.

4. VACANCIES

A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or otherwise, may be filled by the directors for the

ARTICLE V - CONTRACTS, LOANS, CHECKS AND DEPOSITS

1. CONTRACTS

The directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

2. LOANS

No loans shall be contracted on behalf of the foundation and no evidences in indebtedness shall be issued in its name unless authorized by a resolution of the directors. Such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

3. CHECKS, DRAFTS, ETC.

All checks, drafts, or others orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the foundation shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the foundation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the directors.

4. DEPOSITS

All funds of the foundation not otherwise employed shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the foundation in such banks, trust companies or other depositaries as the directors may select.

ARTICLE VI - CERTIFICATES FOR SHARES AND THEIR TRANSFER

1. CERTIFICATES FOR SHARES

Certificates representing membership of the corporation shall be as designated in Article 6 of the charter of this corporation.

2. TRANSFER OF MEMBERSHIP

In accordance with Article 6 of the charter of this corporation, the transfer ability of the certificates of membership are restricted completely except as provided for therein.

ARTICLE VII - SEAL

The directors may provide a corporate seal which shall be circular in form and shall have inscribed thereon the name of the corporation, the state of incorporation, year of incorporation and the words, "Corporate Seal."

ARTICLE VIII - WAIVER OF NOTICE

Unless otherwise provided by law, whenever any notice is required to be given to any member or director of the corporation under the provisions of these by-laws or under the provisions of the articles of incorporation, a waiver thereof in writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be altered, amended or repealed and new by-laws may be adopted by a vote of the members representing a majority of all the members at any annual membership meeting or at any special member meeting when the proposed amendment has been set out in the notice of such meeting.





PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

PROPOSED PROGRAMMING POLICIES

As stated in Applicant's proposal to advance educational programming in the community (Exhibit 11) the Foundation proposes to provide educational broadcast service to the proposed service area, Lake Charles, Louisiana and the surrounding communities, with teaching and general educational programs broadcast daily intermixed with appropriate light entertainment programming including inspirational music. It is proposed that the station will serve primarily Lake Charles, but will provide educational programming to the other towns and communities within the service contour on a secondary basis.

Lake Charles, Louisiana, is located in the Southwest portion of Louisiana and is surrounded by small towns. This area is one of rapid population growth and it is believed that the proposed educational programming format will fill an obvious void in the community.

The proposed programming will include general educational, instructional, news, public affairs, update weather summaries, religious and light entertainment programming. The Foundation will endeavor to provide programming discussing controversial issues of public importance and, when these controversial issues are broadcast, the Foundation will provide programming covering all sides of the issue in keeping with the tenets of the Fairness Doctrine. In the provision of religious programming, time will be provided for the presentation of views of varied religious groups.

In order to obtain instructional and general educational programming, the Foundation will cooperate with local educational institutions including, specifically, McNeese University, SOWELA Technical College, Calcasieu Parish School Board, and Parkview Academy, to obtain specific programming as well as to enlist the assistance of those institutions in providing students for broadcasting. It is believed that this program will be mutually beneficial in that the educational institutions will supply educational programming and the Foundation will afford a facility for training of students in preparation, production and airing of educational programming.

The Foundation proposes to include in a typical broadcast week programming related to education and the discussion of educational issues dealing with the needs and problems of people living within the proposed service area. The programming will encompass specific announcements throughout the broadcast week relating to education and educational opportunities in the listening area. The proposed program format included herein (Exhibit P) will provide further information regarding the proposed educational programming policy of the Foundation.

Southwest Educational Media Foundation, Inc., is a non-profit corporation formed under the laws of the State of Louisiana for the purpose of acquiring and operating a non-commercial, educational broadcast station providing educational broadcast service to Lake Charles, Louisiana, primarily with coverage to be provided on a secondary basis to other communities located within the station's service contour, including, among others, Sulphur, Westlake, DeQuincy, Starks, and Cameron, Louisiana.

The Foundation proposes educational programming including instructional and general educational programs, mixed with light entertainment programming to attract a wide listening audience. The Foundation has solicited and received assurances from several local educational institutions which will provide educational programs and assistance in staffing by providing students that would work at the station on a voluntary basis for the purpose of improving their education in the field of broadcasting as well as other educational areas. The following educational institutions have expressed a wish to become involved in providing educational programming and student broadcasters:

McNeese University

Dr. David Rigney, head of the Radio and Television Department, has agreed to assist in promoting education programs by allowing the college students freedom to produce broadcast programs and refer students for educational training.

Sowela Technical College

Mr. Dallas Fontenot, Communications Director, has expressed an interest in producing educational programming and referring students for educational training at the station.

Calcasieu Parish School Board

Mr. Billy Moses, Director of Communications, has agreed to provide cooperation with the Foundation in promoting education at the station through the use of individual staff members at the local high schools.

Parkview Academy

The academy has agreed to aid the community by providing instructional and general educational programs for broadcast at the proposed radio station.

Southwest Educational Media Foundation proposes to specifically designate periods of the broadcast day for training of students from the various colleges in order to enhance the broadcast experience of each student. The Foundation proposes to operate the facility to provide programming to the local community, which will encourage education and educational opportunities. Specific announcements of educational opportunities and facilities will be a regular part of the station's programming. It is the intent of the Foundation to solicit additional programming from other area educational institutions. The facility is intended to enhance and encourage local educational opportunities as well as provide an enjoyable light entertainment format for members of its listening audience.
