Dear Ms. Connors,

Thank you for the opportunity to provide input on significant issue and concerns. I believe that the following items are significant not only to the Township of Clark, but to all the municipalities in New Jersey.

One concern is the increasing cost of Federal and State mandate. The New Jersey Legislature has not taken action on legislation that would require the State to pay for any mandate. This legislation is necessary since they have a broad leased tax, rather than relying on property tax as the major source of revenue.

Another concern is the need for new ratables to help offset the rising costs over which municipalities have no control. The reliance on property taxes, as stated above, make this the only way to reduce the impact on residents.

The disposal of solid waste is another major concern. For years, the State has mandated that each county solve this problem on their own. Now that many counties are moving ahead with incinerators, the State has decided to look at combining counties, as they should have done originally. In addition, most counties have made no provision for composts of grass, leaving this to the municipalities. Many have no space, and even if they did, it would be more cost effective to do it on a regional basis.

Another concern is finding willing, able and capable people for elective office. The amount of time that is required, with low remuneration, makes it difficult to


Dear Bill:


Dear Sam:
