I apologize for the delay in responding to your letter. While I am pleased that an extraordinary number of New Yorkers have taken the time to contact my office recently, this increasing volume prevents me from responding to you as promptly as you deserve.

I do thank you for contacting me regarding cable television re-regulation legislation.

As you know, the Senate passed S. 12, the Cable Television Consumer Protection Act, by a vote of 73-18 on January 31, 1992. S. 12 would re-regulate rates and service for certain cable systems which do not face free market competition. It would level the playing field for TV stations that seek retransmission of their broadcasts. Additionally, S. 12 would also allow local authorities the ability to regulate services and rates, within guidelines to be set by the Federal Communications Commission. I voted for S. 12. Much of the cable industry exercises monopoly power according to the Federal Communications Commission. In such cases, it is proper and necessary for the government to intervene.

S. 12 would provide for the elimination of government regulation when effective cable competition develops. The free market is preferable to government intervention, when viable. Until that time, S. 12 will protect the interests of American consumers.

Again, I thank you for contacting me. Please do not hesitate to do so in the future on this or any other matter of concern.

Knowing that you share my concern about the continuation of military aid to El Salvador, I wanted to update you on some recent developments.


I am encouraged that there is forward momentum in the U.N. sponsored peace talks between the Government of El Salvador and the FMLN. This progress gives renewed hope that a lasting cease-fire and a permanent peace may soon be found in El Salvador.

I further believe that the United States Congress, by applying the brakes to the Bush Administration's rush to provide military aid to the Salvadoran government, has played an important role in bringing these two parties to the table. Certainly this is no time to give up on a policy of apparent success.

Therefore, I have recently cosponsored H.R. 1346, the Peace, Democracy and Development in El Salvador Act, introduced by Congressman McDermott. This important piece of legislation would continue to withhold American military assistance until such time as there is a clear and just resolution to the November 1989 murders of Catholic priests. Furthermore, the bill puts the Congress clearly on record in support of a negotiated settlement to this ongoing conflict.

I hope you find this information encouraging, and if I can assist you with any other matter of concern to you, please do not hesitate to let me know.
