I am writing this letter to tell you of the greatest epidemic this country has ever experienced.

It strikes people of all ages. Unlike AIDS there are no restrictions as to who can contract this disease. Like AIDS, it disrupts the immune system. Unfortunately, it is easily contracted and there is NO CURE! That's why this disease, CFIDS (Chronic Fatigue Immune Dysfunction Syndrome) deserves your attention.

Comedian, Gilda Radnor suffered from CFIDS. CFIDS allowed ovarian cancer (the cells responsible for preventing cancer in CFIDS patients are characterized as being fewer in number and lackadaisical) to destroy her.

The public is very interested in CFIDS. For instance, Newsweek did a cover story on CFIDS (November 1990). That issue was their bestselling issue for the year. I recently appeared as a special guest on the Irv Homer Show. The reception for CFIDS information was so great that the show was extended an extra hour. In addition, the doctor that joined me on the show has been overwhelmed with new CFIDS patients. Two local newspapers ran detailed articles on CFIDS (Gloucester County Times and Courier Post) with our group's cooperation. We continue to be deluged with phone calls, though it's been almost a week since the last CFIDS story appeared in a newspaper.

~~I am a public speaker, programmer, and~~ by one of the largest defense contractors in the nation, Computer Sciences Corporation. This disease has been so devastating that I am now ~~on disability at age 35~~. Though greatly fatigued, I use whatever energy that exists to devote to my family, GOD, and educating the public on CFIDS.

Enclosed you will find a great deal of information on CFIDS. I'd like to thank you in advance for your intention of educating the public on what is probably the greatest epidemic this country has ever known.


