**1994 Board of Directors Election Slated  
At National Exchange Carrier Association**

Whippany, N.J. -- (July 21, 1993) -- Candidate slates for Subset 1, 2, and 3 positions are set for the 1994 National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA) Board of Directors election.

**Subset 3 Nominees**

Eleven candidates, including eight incumbents and three new nominees, will compete for the nine Subset 3 seats. The new candidates, nominated by submitting at least 25 letters of nomination from Subset 3 member companies, are Eddie L. **Subset 2 Nominees**

This subset is represented on NECA's board by three directors with three nominees for the seats. In July, Subset 2 nominated Jorge R. Menendez, senior vice president--Finance and Administration for the Puerto Rico Telephone Company, to fill the seat being vacated by Vern K. Dunham, Pacific Telecom, Vancouver, Washington, who is retiring.

Incumbents nominated for re-election are Linda D. Hershman, Southern New England Telephone Company (SNET), New Haven, Connecticut, and Arland R. Hocker, Telephone & Data Systems (TDS Telecom), Madison, Wisconsin.

**Subset 1 Nominees**

This Subset is also represented by three directors. In July, Subset 1 nominated John A. Gueldner, vice president--Regulatory for Pacific Bell, San Francisco, California, to replace Frederick W. Hughes, Ameritech Services, Inc., who is retiring.

Incumbents nominated for reelection are Patrick A. Hanley, Bell Atlantic, McLean, Virginia, and Danley T. Hubbard, Southwestern Bell Telephone Company, St. Louis, Missouri.

**Outside Directors**

A recent Federal Communications Commission ruling also makes it possible for NECA's current outside directors, Gloria L. Gaylord of Willoughby, Ohio and Nels J. Smith of Sundance, Wyoming to serve additional one-year terms. At NECA's May Board of Directors meeting, Gaylord, a previous Ohio Public Utilities Commissioner, and Smith, a former Wyoming Public Service Commissioner, were nominated subject to Commission approval of NECA's waiver request. Outside directors are elected by the entire membership according to Association bylaws.

**Election Process**

Profiles of all candidates, including outside directors, will be published in a special edition of Newsbrief in early September.

Election ballots for all Subsets will be mailed to members eligible to vote on September 6 by Deloitte & Touche, inspectors of election. Companies may cast their ballot by mail or in person at the NECA annual meeting, to be held October 13 in Atlanta.
