On behalf of Sistema Universitario Ana G. Mendez, Inc. ("SUAGM"), licensee of noncommercial educational television stations WMTJ, Fajardo and WQTO, Ponce, both in Puerto Rico, we hereby seek to add stations WMTJ and WQTO to the list of television stations seeking pre-Phase I transitions to post-auction channel assignments, as set forth in the November 14, 2017 letter filed on behalf of the coalition of television stations ("Requesting Stations") in Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands requesting the Commission to revise their Post-Auction Broadcast Transition phase assignments and deadlines.

SUAGM's stations in Puerto Rico similarly experienced damage from Hurricanes Irma and Maria, and as of this date are still off-air. While it may be possible for SUAGM to restore some degree of service over WMTJ and/or WQTO on their current channels once the extent of damage has been assessed and electric power restored, SUAGM agrees with the Requesting Stations that full restoration of service would best be made on the reassignment channels.

SUAGM also joins the Requesting Stations in urging that the Media Bureau allow liberal extensions of time and/or STAs to ensure continuation of service where conditions beyond its control precludes strict adherence to a new transition schedule.
