

The free conference line has impacted my life by renewing and improving my mother tongue of Pennsylvania Dutch, by helping me fall asleep, by making me aware of by-words, and by making connections with old friends and meeting new friends. You might call it networking. We have made trips to get together with conference line friends. I bought a song index and a book because I heard about them on the free conference line.

I have listened to an out-of-state funeral, and been comforted with singing. My elderly mother's siblings from several states all talked together on her birthday. I was able to listen to conferences and seminars about singing and Anabaptist topics when I couldn't attend. My husband listened as a pastime recently while
