MAAC Community Charter School was established to the increasing need for a supportive, alternative environment to help struggling students gain self-learning and earn a high school diploma.

MAAC Community Charter School (MCCS) offers students a unique curriculum that integrates traditional subjects in relation to real-world issues. Our community-based approach is rooted in the theory of Critical Pedagogy and encourages an atmosphere in which academic diversity is embraced. Chartered by Sweetwater Union High School District 24 years old and provides the same core education classes offered at district schools. The "Pathway" tracts provide students with a baseline knowledge and skill set in healthcare, business and entrepreneurship, and theatre arts.

Today, MCCS serves over 300 students at its lively Chula Vista campus. Many are the first of their families to graduate high school with plans to continue on. MCCS's Class of 2017 boasted 92 graduates; their plans after high school include college, training, joining the military and community volunteering.

The Mission of MAAC Community Charter School is to:

- Provide a safe and accepting environment where diversity is recognized and valued.
- Provide an effective, qualified, and caring staff who are available to meet the needs of all students.
- Provide a challenging curriculum through project and problem based learning.

Enrollment

MCCS is open to any resident of San Diego County. Enrollment begins prior to the start of four grading sessions in August, January, March and June. All prospective students must attend an orientation and advising meeting to ensure an academic program can be developed that meets their educational and personal needs.
