I write to support the Comments of the Cable Act Preservation Alliance ("CAPA") and to disapprove of the proposals and tentative conclusions set forth in the FCC's September 25 Further Notice of Proposed Rule Making in Implementation of Section 621(a)(1) of the Cable Communications Policy Act of 1984 as Amended by the Cable Television Consumer Protection and Competition Act of 1992, MB Docket 05- 311.

Do you realize that Community TV was grown community-by-community based on the reasonable needs of each community? A blanket regulatory/accounting interpretation of 'In-kind' will dismiss the negotiated outcomes of citizens working with corporations over several decades? It has always a David and Goliath situation. The models are so vastly different I cannot foresee a fair way to apply any ruling. To have to take time away from serving my community to deal with this threat is unfortunate.

Could delivery of community voices be more efficient, cost-effective and forward looking? Absolutely. Maybe you should consider ways to incentivize better use of what is payment for rights of way rather than redefining what qualifies as payment.
