I agree with the dissent of Commissioner Rosenworcel and Commissioner Clyburn. Without repeating all the reasons, I agree with the sentiment of responsible citizens who have commented in opposition.

This is an issue that, if finally upheld by the courts, will lead to additional public demands for representation in the course of the next Presidential election. It will motivate voters. Special interests who seek to invest money because of such policies would be well advised that the next President will be called on to see that such policies are reversed. Such investments would not be prudent. I say this having served on the Platform Committees of three Democratic National Conventions, where my proposals were unanimously adopted.

Corporate interests who adopt policies against the public interest do not represent the best interest of investors, shareholders or customers. We understand the same corporations invest in market research that is not well represented by certain political activities in this proceeding.

The vote should have been delayed until the matter of fraudulent use of the internet to file comments in this proceeding was resolved. The public has a right to be concerned about the fraudulent use of the internet, and those who associate with it.
