To Whom It May Concern,

The FCC Public Safety 800 MHz Regional Planning Committee (Region 55-Buffalo) met on October 18, 2018 and unanimously voted in favor of amending the 800 MHz plan in accordance with Improving Public Safety Communications in the 800 MHz Band, Second Report and Order, 23 FCC Rcd 7605 (PSHSB 2008) (CBR Order) Guidance PN, 24 FCC Rcd at 1364. Region 55 previously announced that it had completed 800 MHz Band Configuration pursuant to Public Notice DA 14-1904, released December 30, 2014. A copy of the 800 MHz Transition Administration Summary, dated August 27, 2012 (attached) details how licensed frequencies were reallocated by the 800 MHz Transition Administration. A separate attachment, titled R55 800 TA Frequency Allocation, dated August 27, 2012, shows the resorted frequency allocations. Region 55 currently uses CAPRADAP at <http://www.capradap.org> for managing 800 MHz public safety spectrum and applications.
