Re: Applications of T-Mobile US, Inc. and Sprint Corporation for Consent to Transfer Control of Licenses and Authorizations, WT Docket No. 18-197

Dear Ms. Dortch:

T-Mobile US, Inc. (“T-Mobile”) hereby submits a supplement in response to the August 15, 2018, General Information and Document Request from the Federal Communications Commission (the “Commission”) in the above-referenced docket.¹ This supplemental filing includes a further revised privilege log. T-Mobile has undertaken considerable additional efforts to provide additional information as reflected on the revised privilege log submitted today. This revised privilege log reflects the following updates:

- Re-reviewing log entries and documents for a number of custodians and updating the related privilege log entries;
- Re-reviewing log entries and documents for which third parties appear on the privilege log and updating the related privilege log entries;
- Re-reviewing all documents associated with log entries missing a description of the basis for the privilege claim, the nature of the privilege claim, or a description of the subject-matter of the privilege content;
- Revising privilege claim descriptions;
- Adding custodian information to log entries; and
- Updating document descriptions to provide additional clarifying information explaining the privilege claims, including:

- more detail regarding the subject matter (including additional specificity for documents related to the 5G model and the LTE model); and
- identifying the anticipated litigation applicable to a work product claim (including identifying with additional clarity which iteration of the Sprint transaction was applicable).

The supplement consists of a DVD containing “Highly Confidential Information” pursuant to the Protective Order filed in WT Docket No. 18-197.² A copy of the filing, including the DVD, is being provided to the Secretary’s Office. In addition, two copies of the Highly Confidential Filing are being delivered to Kathy Harris, Wireless Telecommunications Bureau, with a copy of the DVD.³ A copy of the Redacted Highly Confidential Filing is being filed electronically through the Commission’s Electronic Comment Filing System.⁴
