My Company NCN Data is small business providing fixed wireless broadband service in northeastern PA. due to the many trees and heavy foliage in Northeastern PA the CBRS band enables us to provide internet service into areas that have no other options for internet service.

The CBRS band is important to the future of our business and the additional spectrum will allow us to provide even faster speeds to our customers. NCN currently offers speeds of up to 75 MBPS over our fixed wireless network. And customer demands will require additional spectrum in the CBRS band.

A change in the CBRS auction rules to increase the size of the PALs to PEAs would make it virtually impossible for NCN Data to acquire any licenses

Our customers demand more bandwidth. Being able to have access to this spectrum will allow us to meet the demands of our customers. These are the same customers that have no other choice but our fixed wireless service.

NCN Data opposes the proposals to increase the size of the PALs to the size of a PEA. As a small business, we were planning to participate in the PAL auctions based on the census tracts.

Please provide us with the means to continue to bridge the broadband gap in Northeastern PA where the other carriers have largely ignored.
